

Ladies & Gentlemen,



SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING 2022

THE FUTURE OF RAFA NEWARK & DISTRICT CLUB?

I appreciate that our calling for a Club Special General Meeting is something of a rarity so I am writing to provide you with the need and rationale for the resolution being tabled. The proposal is to empower the Club Committee to close/dissolve the Club to allow HQ RAFA to dispose of the premises and thereby relieve the Club & Branch of the ongoing and escalating burden of maintaining the building, obviously, not a consideration that has been reached lightly. I need to emphasise from the outset that there is absolutely **NO** intention to close the Branch!

Background.

As you will be aware the RAFA Newark & District Club and Branch have endured some difficult and turbulent times over the past few years that has been injurious to our reputation and indeed we were facing entire closure in early 2021. However, thanks to a small cadre of dedicated members who rallied to raise the necessary Committees to save the day and keep both the Club & Branch going!

Situation

Since then considerable effort has been expended and achieved in trying to rebuild the Club/ Branch to a continuing and viable part of the overall Association. Whilst the overall Branch has a membership of headcount of some 277, it has become increasing clear that the reality is there is only a dedicated core of 20 or so active members many of whom are now of advancing years. Appreciating that still somewhat in the immediate post-COVID era, there is a reluctance for some to venture out and get involved in social events, indeed the Branch 75th Anniversary Celebration Event could only attract 2 members in addition to Committee members attending!

Importantly, as with other like clubs / organisations locally, we are not attracting any new or younger members which does not bode well for the longer sustainability of RAFA in Newark and certainly not in its present guise? As mentioned we are not alone in this situation similar associations locally with Club premises are struggling to continue and survive and we have already seen the closure of a local RBL Branch, at least two Regimental Associations similarly closing through lack of support in the past year.

The Club's Committee and management team have done extraordinarily well in a relative short period of time in re-establishing the business as an emerging profitable and ongoing commercial concern to support our collective charitable aims. However, this has been achieved in the main by hosting private events such as wedding receptions, birthday parties, funeral wakes, etc., but most importantly through the dedication and concerted efforts of our appointed Club manager and her family. Having said that, it should be recognised that this is also a potential single point of failure with an immediate detrimental impact should 'they' choose to 'walk away' for any reason?

Financial

Also, we have recently received a utilities bill for £8.7k and other unanticipated but essential building maintenance bills totalling some £2k. It is also recognised that there will soon be a requirement for some roof and guttering repairs and despite some recent refurbishment work, we are advised that the building will probably need a complete electrical rewire and re-plumbing in some areas in the medium term potentially costing some £20-30K. Whilst we share these expenses with the Branch we have met the current expenditure by drawing down some reserves, it is appreciated that this is very much a one off solution and is not sustainable in the longer term (nor perhaps indeed the best use of Branch charitable monies?)

Equally and more importantly it is felt that any future revenue generated could be necessarily diverted to the maintenance of the premises rather than for the primary charitable purpose of our raison d'etre.

Potential Solution

Whilst both the Club and Branch committees have been pondering and discussing these issues and potential solutions without much success, we have received a serious approach from a local charity who are keen to form a 'Blue Lamp Club' to serve as a social hub for all Armed Services Veterans and Emergency Services' personnel. has expressed an interest in buying our Club & Branch premises in their entirety and with additional sufficient funding to facilitate the total refurbishment of the premises. If this were to happen, they have already indicated that the Branch would be welcome to continue to meet and 'operate' from the premises.

The Way Ahead?

We have been in discussion with RAFA HQ who are not adverse to disposing of the premises and have commenced negotiations with the Charity. However, the final decision rests with the Club membership who have to vote to close the Club and hand the building back to RAFA HQ. Rather than wait until to all negotiations have been completed and avoid any potential further or unnecessary delay, we are asking that the membership votes now to empower the Club committee to make the decision once the negotiations are completed.

Clearly, this is not a situation that any of us would have wished to have found ourselves or be placed in, but realistically having spent much time discussing all the possible options moving forward, the disposal of the property came to the fore as undoubtedly the most practical.

Recognising this would mark the end of an era for RAFA Newark & District Branch please be assured that we do believe that without the burden and continuing diversion of maintaining an increasingly expensive property, the Branch itself can begin to properly regain its strength and return to its former success. Collectively, your committee members have the will and determination to succeed. Thus, I have no hesitation in commending the proposal to you.

I look forward to hopefully seeing you at the SGM to be held at the RAFA Newark & District Branch/Club commencing at 1915 hours on Thursday 13th October 2022.


As we lay you down to rest ma'am, And sorrow sweeps the land, May Phillip be there waiting, To take your weary hand.



Remembrance Sunday — 13th November 2022

This year's Remembrance Day Parade and Church Service will be held in Newark on 13th November. The Parade will assemble in the London Road Car Park and any members wishing to march should arrive before 10.40am

The Unknown Warrior

On September 7th 1920, in strictest secrecy, four unidentified British bodies were exhumed from temporary battlefield cemeteries at Ypres, Arras, the Asine and the Somme.

None of the soldiers who did the digging were told why. The bodies were taken by field ambulance to GHQ at St-Pol -Sur-ter noise.

There the bodies were draped with the union flag. Sentries were posted and Brigadier-General Wyatt and a Colonel Gell selected one body at random.

A French honour guard was selected, and stood by the coffin overnight.



On the morning of the 8th (a specially designed coffin made of oak from the grounds of Hampton Court, was brought and the unknown warrior placed inside.

On top was placed a crusaders sword and a shield on which was inscribed '(a British Warrior who fell in the GREAT WAR 1914-1918 for king and country'.

On The 9th of November the unknown warrior was taken by horse drawn carriage through guards of honour and the sound of tolling bells and bugle calls to the quayside. There it was loaded onto HMS Vernon bound for Dover..... the coffin stood on the deck covered in wreaths and surrounded by the French honour guard.

On arrival at Dover the the unknown warrior was greeted with a 19 gun salute, normally only reserved for field marshals. He then traveled by special train to Victoria Station London.

He stayed there overnight and on the morning of the 11th of November he was taken to Westminster Abbey where he was placed in a tomb at the west end of the nave - his grave was filled in using 100 sandbags of earth from the battlefields.

When the Duke of York (later King George VI) married Lady Ellizabeth Bowes Lyons in the Abbey in 1923 she left her wedding bouquet on the grave as a mark of respect (she had lost a brother during the war) Since then all royal brides married in the Abbey have sent back their bouquets to be laid on the grave.

The idea of the unknown soldier was thought of by a Padre called David Railton who had served at the front during the great war and it was the union flag they used as an altar cloth at the front, that had been draped over the coffin.


It is the intention that all relatives of the 517,773 combatants whose bodies had not been identified could believe that the unknown warrior could very well be their lost husband, Father, brother or son.

We will remember them.


